

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


FIGURE 2.1 - Grooming Table (Elite Table w/Electric Actuator Shown, Components/Models Vary)

### **Grooming Table Set-up**

### **Adjustable Leveling Feet**


Grooming tables equipped with an electric powered lift actuator must be located with an electrical outlet near the unit, dedicated. Do NOT use extension cords to provide power for the table.

### **WARNING** Enlist help and USE SAFE LIFTING PRACTICES during assembly, installation and moving equipment.



Keep hands clear of possible pinch areas during installation, which if not avoided, could result in MINOR to MODERATE INJURY.

- Do NOT lift or move the table by the platform. Always move the table by the base frame using enough personnel and safe lifting procedures.
- **STEP 1:** Lay the table on its side to install the adjustable leveling feet and scuff pads.
- **STEP 2:** Thread the leveling screws (feet) into the bottom of the frame. Leave 1/2" of screw threading exposed. See FIGURE 2.2
- STEP 3: Slip a scuff pad over each leveling foot.





### **Grooming Arm**



The Elite Grooming Table is equipped with a shepherds hook shaped grooming arm that can be used to secure a lead.

### **NOTICE** The grooming arm must be installed before installing the lower slide stop and scuff ball.

The grooming arm can be adjusted vertically by loosening the height adjustment bracket. There are slide stop pins located at the bottom and halfway up the grooming arm to prevent vertical arm movement beyond these limits.



Several holes along the top/end of the arm are used for the leash eyelet. Remove the nut and reposition the eyelet to the desired location as needed.

The swivel bracket controls lateral movement. Disengage the lock handle by pulling downward to rotate the arm around the end of the table, there are five locked positions. Ensure the swivel bracket is locked in position before securing animals to the grooming arm. See FIGURE 2.3

### Adjustable Grooming Arm

The grooming arm can be installed with the table on its side. The following instructions provide direction for installing the arm with the table upright with the top fully raised to its uppermost position.


To install the grooming arm into the height adjustment bracket the lower slide stop must be removed from the grooming arm. Remove the acorn nut, spacers and bolt. If the arm is equipped with post end plug, remove before installing the grooming arm.

## WARNING Enlist help and USE SAFE LIFTING PRACTICES during assembly, installation and moving equipment.

**CAUTION** Keep hands clear of possible pinch areas during installation, which if not avoided, could result in MINOR to MODERATE INJURY.

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- **STEP 1:** Slide the height bracket over the end of the arm swivel bracket if it is not already installed. Loosen the height adjustment bracket knob. See FIGURE 2.4
- **STEP 2:** Slide the straight long end of the grooming arm down into and through the top of the height adjust bracket. Ensure the top of the shepherds hook is facing towards the center of the table. Allow the arm to rest on the height control bracket, tighten the knob to help aid in the scuff ball installation.








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### Scuff Ball

**STEP 3:** Thread the shoulder bolt through the bottom hole of the scuff ball and into the insert nut (teeth towards bolt) unit the insert nut is just below the top of the scuff ball. See FIGURE 2.6



- **STEP 4:** Carefully align and insert the scuff ball assembly onto the end of the grooming arm. Apply pressure and work (wiggle) until the ball is seated to the bottom of the arm. See FIGURE 2.7
- **STEP 5:** Tighten (tool provided) the shoulder bolt to secure the scuff ball in place. Do NOT over-tighten.



The shoulder bolt head should be recessed into the scuff ball. If the bolt head is exposed it can cause damage to the floor surface.

#### Lower Slide Stop

The lower slide stop pin is NOT used on some models of the grooming arm. The stop pin holes may be blocked by the scuff ball. Omit the stop pin if there is interference with the scuff ball assembly.




FIGURE 2.8 - Lower Slide Stop Pin

- **STEP 6:** Slide one of the spacers onto the lower slide bolt and insert through the lower hole on the arm. See FIGURE 2.8
- **STEP 7:** Insert the second spacer onto the screw and secure by tightening the acorn nut onto the bolt. Do NOT over-tighten.

### Fixed Grooming Arm (Optional Accessory)

Shor-Line offers two grooming table top sizes; Standard model measuring 26x42.5" long and Large measuring 26x48" long grooming tables that are equipped with the framing and mounting holes for the Fixed Grooming Arm. Ensure the bracket is the correct size for the table. The standard arm bracket will NOT fit on a large table.

### **NOTICE** The Fixed Grooming Arm is not compatible with the Shor-Pet grooming table.

The fixed grooming arm is mounted on the opposite end of the table. The arm bracket is bolted to the underside of the table top frame. The height can be adjusted using the same procedures as the adjustable grooming arm.





FIGURE 2.9 - Fixed Grooming Arm

To install the fixed grooming arm into the height adjustment bracket the lower slide stop must be removed from the grooming arm. Remove the acorn nut, spacers and bolt. If the arm is equipped with post end plug, remove before installing the fixed grooming arm. See FIGURE 2.9

- **STEP 1:** Secure the fixed arm bracket to the underside of the table top frame using the hardware provided. See FIGURE 2.10
- **STEP 2:** Slide the height bracket over the end of the arm swivel bracket if it is not already installed. Loosen the height adjustment bracket knob.
- **STEP 3:** Slide the straight long end of the grooming arm down into and through the top of the height adjustment bracket. Ensure the top of the shepherds hook is facing towards the center of the table. Allow the arm to rest on the height control bracket, tighten the knob to help aid in the scuff ball installation.



**STEP 4:** Follow the adjustable arm procedures to complete the installation of the fixed grooming arm, lower slide stop pin and the scuff ball.


### Use And Care



### **Safe Use Practices**

Always use safe practices during loading and unloading patients from the grooming table. All procedures should be created by the facility owner and followed. Common sense and being aware of safety concerns should always drive procedures. Below is a list of recommendations and situational conditions that require attention, heed all warnings.

- Unplug the unit before conducting any maintenance or cleaning procedures. Do NOT allow any personnel under or around the unit when plugged into a power outlet.
- Do NOT operate the grooming table before checking to ensure the unit and surrounding area is clear of personnel, animals and obstructions.
- Do NOT operate the grooming table on uneven flooring. Adjust leveling feet to ensure the unit is stable and the patient is secure during operation.
- Do NOT sit, stand or lean on the table. Animal use ONLY.



Do NOT leave patients on the table unattended. Failure to do so could result in SERIOUS INJURY or DEATH.

ALWAYS maintain full control of patients when using the table or its operable functions. Failure to do so could result in SERIOUS INJURY or DEATH.

### Adjustable Grooming Arm, Shepherds Hook

The adjustable grooming arm and shepherds hook can be adjusted to rotate around the end of the table and the shepherds hook can be raised or lowered as required for patient height.

Damage caused by aftermarket accessories attached to Shor-Line tables may void product warranty.

### Lift Function

The grooming table is equipped with either an electric or hydraulic lift feature to raise and lower the table platform approximately 21 inches.

#### Do NOT use the table functions before checking to ensure the unit and surrounding **WARNING** area are clear of personnel, animals and obstructions. Failure to do so could result in SERIOUS INJURY or DEATH.

Keep personnel and animals clear of the foot operated lift control switch, unintentional table functions (movement) could occur. Failure to do so could result in SERIOUS INJURY or DEATH.

### Electric Lift

The electric lift is operated by a foot activated pedal. Depress the pedal to raise and lower the platform. Release the pedal to stop movement. See FIGURE 3.1, 3.2 & 3.3


The electric lift is capable of lifting up to 250 lbs of weight on the table top surface.



### NOTICE

Do NOT exceed the weight limitations (250 lbs) of the table. Exceeding the weight limit may cause equipment failure.

When not in use, store the grooming table in the down position and unplug the unit.

### Hydraulic Lift

The Hydraulic lift is operated by a foot activated pedal. Depressing the pedal lifts the table surface inches per pump. To lower the table, fully depress and hold the pedal until the top reaches the desired height. Release the pedal to stop movement. See FIGURE 3.4

### **General Maintenance & Care**

### Maintenance Recommendations

#### Routine maintenance will extend the quality and life of Shor-Line products.

It is the owners responsibility to set-up scheduled maintenance programs, depending on use of the equipment. Scheduled preventive maintenance should include, but not limited to daily or weekly inspections and maintenance of products to prolong its longevity and to help maintain proper product functions.

- Follow manufacturers cleaning and maintenance recommendations outlined in product literature provided for components not included in these recommendations. Configurations/component parts may vary.
- Check alignment of operable panels, doors and components to ensure operation is free of obstructions. Adjust as required.
- Check any battery compartments to ensure the batteries are not failing, corroding the contacts or damaging the equipment. A pencil eraser can be used to clean electrical contacts in battery compartments.
- Check any wiring for kinks or exposed inner wiring. If damage exist, stop equipment use and contact Shor-Line Technical Services for direction.
- Check any hydraulic lift components for leaking fluid. If fluid is present, stop equipment use and contact Shor-Line Technical Services for direction. Do NOT attempt to repair hydraulic leaks.

#### **Care Recommendations**

### Routine product care will extend the quality and life of Shor-Line products and aids in protecting animals from transmittable diseases and infections.

It is the owners responsibility to set-up scheduled cleaning programs, depending on use of the equipment. Scheduled preventive cleaning should include, but not limited to daily or weekly inspections and cleaning of products to prolong its longevity and to help maintain finishes.

### **Safe Cleaning Practices**

- Use the mildest cleaning procedure that will complete the job effectively. Ordinary waste deposits and fluids can usually be removed with soap and water, using a soft cloth or sponge. Rinse thoroughly with clear water and dry completely with a soft cloth to discourage hard-water spotting.
- Minor scale build up and some hard water spotting can be removed by washing with a vinegar diluted mixture followed by a clear water rinse and thorough drying.
- Bleach, deodorizing agents, disinfectants, and sanitizers can corrode stainless steel, thoroughly rinse all surfaces treated with these chemicals with a clear water rinse and dry with a soft cloth.
- If scrubbing is required, use only polymer or nylon fiber products made for use with polymer or nylon materials.
- Always rinse with clear water and dry of all surfaces treated with cleaning, sterilization solutions.

### **Unsafe Cleaning Practices (NOT Recommended)**

- Do NOT use a dry cloth or wipe clear polymer surfaces which can scratch if dust/dirt is wiped with the hand or dry cloth.
- Polymer materials can discolor if exposed to sunlight, ultraviolet rays. Avoid direct sun exposure.
- Do NOT use ammonia or bleaches to clean polymer surfaces.
- Do NOT allow fluids to accumulate, puddle without removing and completely drying the surfaces and components. Standing water/fluids are a hazard and can cause damage to component materials.

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• Do NOT use scouring powders that will scratch polymer finishes.

### Lubricating Joints




The lift frame connection joints may begin to squeak over time. To properly lubricate the frame joints, loosen the connection bolts by 1/4 turn. Spray lubricate between the frame members. Do NOT re-tighten the connection bolts.

### Foot Switch Sensitivity



Spring Plate Adjustment

#### Routine product care will extend the quality and life of Shor-Line products.

NOTICE Grooming tables equipped with electric lift actuators are operated by a foot operated pedal. Inside the pedal control box there is a spring plate that may loosen due to frequent use of operation for extended periods of time.

If the foot operated pedal appears to be less responsive, the spring plate screws may be tightened to elevate pedal sensitivity issues. See FIGURE 3.5






Fully extend (raise) the table top and unplug the unit before continuing with the procedures. The pedal control box cover and the spring plate adjustment screws are accessible from the topside of the unit. The unit can be set on its side for the procedures if preferred.

**STEP 1:** Secure the fixed arm bracket to the underside of the table top frame using the hardware provided. See FIGURE 2.10

**STEP 2:** Tighten the two center screws with a 4mm Allen wrench.

Do NOT plug-in the power cord until the installation is complete and the equipment is DANGER ready for use. Ensure the power cord is free of kinks and not bound/pinched.

Do NOT use the table functions before checking to ensure the unit and surrounding area are clear of personnel, animals and obstructions. Failure to do so could result in SERIOUS INJURY or DEATH.

Keep personnel and animals clear of the foot operated lift control switch, unintentional table functions (movement) could occur. Failure to do so could result in SERIOUS **INJURY or DEATH.**
